Quarterly Commentary / Pool Attribution Current/(Target) Asset Allocation Equity markets declined in the third quarter on the prospect of higher-for-longer interest rates and slower economic growth. U.S. Equity markets, as measured by the S&P 500 Index, fell 3.3%. Nine of the eleven sectors of the S&P 500 generated negative results, led by Utilities (-9.3%) and Real Estate (-8.9%). The U.S. Dollar appreciated relative to most major currencies. Developed Non-U.S. Markets, as measured by the MSCI EAFE Index, fell 4.1% and Emerging Markets, as measured by the MSCI Emerging Markets Index, declined 2.9%. The Federal Open Market Committee voted to increased the Fed funds rates by 25 bps in July after a pause in June. The current target rate is 5.25-5.50%. The 10-year Treasury yield rose 73 basis points to 4.57%, and the 30-year yield rose 88 basis points to 4.73%. Cash & The Short Term Pool performed in line with its Benchmark during the quarter.
